
Sharmaine Palama- Taylorsville Elementary

January Awareness Month

On December 31, 1969, President Richard Nixon signed a proclamation dedicating January as National Blood Donor Month. (NBDM). It was meant to honor those voluntary blood donors and to bring awareness to and encourage more to donate blood

during a time when more blood is needed. Statistically, the month of January is typically a period of time where there are critical blood shortages. Blood donations start to slow down during the holiday season and during cold and flu season. Now, with COVID very much prominent in our lives, the need for donations is in high demand all year long. The American Red Cross and Blood Banks of America encourage all that are capable of donating to do so. Millions of people's lives rely on them.

Below are some statistics from the <u>American Red Cross</u> to help understand the dire need for blood donations.

- Blood is needed every two seconds in the US to help those battling illness or injury.
- As COVID-19 cases have risen across the US, so has the need for convalescent plasma. We are currently facing a potential shortage of this life saving product.
- Approximately 29,000 units of red blood cells are needed every day in the US.
- Less than 38 percent of the US population is eligible to give blood or platelets.
- The blood type most often requested by hospitals is type 0, also known as the universal blood type.
- One donation has the potential to save up to three lives.
- More than 1.8 million people were diagnosed with cancer in 2020, many of them in need of blood daily.
- A single car accident victim can require as many as 100 units of blood.
- Red blood cells must be used within 42 days or less.

Tried & True Recipe

<u>Lemon Bars</u>

(Grandma Joann Simons' Recipe)

Ingredients:

Crust:

- 1 cup butter, softened
- dash of salt
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 2 cups flour
- zest of 1 lemon
 Filling:
- 4 eggs
- 2 cups sugar
- 1/4 cup flour
- 6 tbsp fresh lemon juice

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- Crust Combine all crust ingredients in food processor, pulse until the texture of coarse sand. Press mixture into a prepared (baking spray) 9x13 pan. Bake on middle rack for 12-15 minutes, until just starting to brown.
- Filling– While the crust is baking, combine flour and sugar. Mix in beaten eggs and lemon juice. Pour over slightly cooled crust (so you don't scramble your eggs) then put the pan back in the oven for another 20-25 minutes until filling is just set. There should be a slight wobble, but nothing fluid.
- 4. Dust with powdered sugar once completely cool, cut into squares and serve.

Information Systems

Our goal in Information Systems is to get as many parents to sign up for a parent portal account so parents can have access to district resources right at their fingertips.

With technology growing faster than most can adapt, we have impressively increased the number of our parent portal accounts. Yes, it was probably COVID, but if we can start somewhere, we will take it!

Below is the past four years' (including current) of the growth of accounts created.

Parent Portal Accounts created:

- SY2022 (So Far): 4,553
- SY2021: 12,322
- SY2020: 5,611
- SY2019: 3,161

Did You Know?

Did you know parents with accounts will receive weekly grades and attendance emails every Friday for each of their students? Last Friday there were 49,889 emails sent!

Out of 65,670 current legal guardians, 45,955 have an email address in the system and 33,673 have a portal account. That is 51% of current legal guardians, in Granite School District, that currently have an account!

To help encourage our parents to sign up for an account, you can identify which parents do not have an account, by running the GSD Portal Account Status Report, in Discovery. You can then export your list and send a message to the parents by phone, text or email, in Blackboard.

Reasons parents would want a portal account is:

- Update phone and email for contacts for students
- Ability to track student progress in the Gradebook/Canvas
- View student documents such as, report cards, test scores, progress toward graduation
- Pay school lunch
- Register online for school (if school is participating)
- Sign up for parent teacher conferences (if school is participating)


