As one of the largest school districts in the state of Utah, Granite District maintains many programs that operate outside of the traditional K-12 options. Many of these programs operate under the radar

with the majority of Granite employees unaware of the service they provide. Granite Peaks Adult Education is one such program. During the 2022-2023 school year Granite Peaks Adult Education provided service to more than 4,500 students from six locations throughout Salt Lake County. Education services they provide are high school credit completion, high school equivalent diploma completion (GED), English language classes, workforce training, digital literacy, and naturalization (U.S. citizenship). Granite Peaks helps hundreds of students each year graduate from high school, transition to college, and improve their careers. Granite Peaks operates classes year-round with morning, afternoon, and evening options available. Our main location (501 East 3900 South) is open from 8:00 am to 9:00 pm Monday through Thursday and Friday from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm. We hold classes in person and online with students attending from multiple counties across the state. We are proud to be the largest adult education program in the

#### Office Program Tips and Tricks

Learning and using keyboard shortcuts can significantly enhance your productivity across all Microsoft Office applications, including Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and more. By using shortcuts, you can perform various tasks quickly without the need to navigate through menus and ribbons with your mouse. This not only saves time but also reduces the strain on your wrists and hands.

Here are a few essential keyboard shortcuts to get you started:

Ctrl + S: Save (in most Office applications).

Ctrl + C: Copy.

Ctrl + X: Cut.

Ctrl + V: Paste.

Ctrl + Z: Undo.

Ctrl + Y: Redo.

Ctrl + F: Find.

Ctrl + B: Bold (in Word).

Ctrl + I: Italicize (in Word).

Ctrl + U: Underline (in Word).
