## Back up your stuff - Submitted by: Clay M. Glad, Network Engineer

Facts: The most valuable part of your computer is your data, which is stored on a hard drive (a moving part that will die; it's just a matter of when). You are responsible for your data; not IT, not your STS or NE, not your computer tech - you. You need a backup. Buy and install (follow the instructions that come with it) backup external hard drives bundled with backup software, and adjust the settings so it will also back up your M:\ drive. For Windows I like "Seagate Backup Plus"; Google will find it for you under \$100. On a Mac I like "Seagate Plus". When you plug it in your Mac will ask, so just tell it to let "Time Machine" do the backup. Think of it like car insurance. 95% of us will never need to get data off of that backup drive, but for the 5% that do - it's a lifesaver.

I showed up for work two weeks ago to a broken computer - my hard drive had died. When I got my repaired computer back it only took me a couple of hours to have everything back and running because (drum roll please) I have a USB hard drive behind my computer that has a backup of everything. Get a backup drive; it's well worth it.

### Recipe Corner: Easy office recipes

Alejandra's Granola

9 cups old fashioned rolled oats

3 cups coconut flakes

2.5 cups any nuts you like

1.5 cups sunflower seeds

2 cups cooking (I like to use only 1.5 cups of canola oil)

2 cups warm honey

4-5 cups any combination of dried fruit

Note: I have tried raisins, cranberries, cran-strawberries, papaya, pineapple and mango

Pre-heat your oven to 350 degrees. Mix the first four ingredients in an extra big bowl, mix well, and then add the oil and warm honey. Mix well until everything is covered with honey, add oil.

Scoop about 6 cups of your oats mixture onto three baking sheets (2 cups per sheet). Put baking sheets in the oven for about 7-10 minutes or until golden brown. Mix together one sheet of oat mixture with 1/3 of the fruit mixture in a large bowl. Let the mixture cool. Store in a covered container.

Repeat the fruit and oat mixture for the other two trays. Store! ENJOY!!

### **Winter Walking Tips -** Submitted by: Merilynn Boekweg, Executive Board Member

Winter snow and the ice it brings to cover the roads, sidewalks and parking lots can be quite dangerous. Falls due to ice and snow are one of the most common winter injuries.

Take steps now to prevent a fall by learning and implementing these suggestions:

### Be Safe

- Plan extra time on your schedule to prevent being in a rush. Most accidents occur due to inattention or being in a hurry.
- Remove snow from shoes before entering any building.
- Always use a handrail when climbing up and down stairs.
- Always use handrail when going in and out of buildings, vehicles or public transportation.
- Wear footwear with traction.

### **Be Smart**

- Walk at a slower pace.
- Stay on designated walkways.
- Watch for and avoid slippery surfaces.

#### Be Seen

- Wear visible clothing especially at night or during heavy snow.
- Wait for vehicles to stop completely before crossing the road.
- Approaching vehicles may not be able to stop immediately due to road conditions.

If you fall, relax and try to fall as limply as possible. Avoid using your arms to stop your fall. If you need immediate medical attention, call 911. (University of Utah Environmental Health & Safety)

**Bonus Winter Tip:** We know its plain common sense, but there's no harm in mentioning it: no cowboy boots, sneakers, leather shoes and plastic-soled shoes.
