What is GCPS?

Would you like to earn an extra \$660.00 to \$905.00? We have a program for you! Granite Certified Professional Standards program (GCPS) is designed to encourage professional growth through education. Secretaries who obtain a <u>professional certificate</u> through GCPS will be paid an extra amount each year in recognition of their achievement in obtaining the certificate.




You can achieve any of the levels of GCPS through education or job enhancement training. Payment for certificates for contract secretaries will be added into your annual salary, and divided among the 24 paychecks. Payments for GCPS certificates for non-contract secretaries (who work at least 20 hours per week) will be made once a year in April. The dollar amount will be prorated based on the number of hours worked.

Rules and procedures for obtaining a GCPS certificate are established by Granite School District and can be found at http://gaeop.weebly.com/pspgcop.html. There will be a workshop later this school year to answer questions and give you an opportunity to have face to face guidance to apply for a certificate. Discovery Reminders: Things to Make Sure YOU do...


- Register and Enroll students using their BIRTH CERTIFICATE not the registration card!
- Check for **Duplicate Student** by using the Advanced Search, checking the Enrolled and Released box, and really looking at the other information on the child!
- Scan ALL records into OptiView! No more paper and no more forwarding of paper cum files in or out of the district!
- Attend all trainings to stay on top of things and to be aware of updates/changes.
- Double-check your entries for accuracy (names, birthdates, birth country, grade level, and schedule/homeroom-depending on whether you are secondary/elementary).
- ⇒ Look really closely before deciding you have found a child with an existing record! Things you should not be changing include age, birthdate and name! If you make changes, you are destroying another student's records if they are truly NOT the same person!
- ⇒ STOP & THINK before you click or make a change in Discovery! Your entries really control so very many things!

Apple & Raisin Coleslaw

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 3 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 1 1/2 tablespoons white balsamic vinegar
