Rick is also a co-author of a book titled "Earning An 'A' With Kids". This book shares the Ten A's of building strong relationships with kids. Some, if not all, can also be applied to our work relationships. They are:

- 1. Acceptance Accept them with no judgment
- 2. Acknowledgement Show interest
- 3. Acclaim Praise and applaud accomplishments
- 4. Action Spend time with them
- 5. Approval Deeper level of acceptance
- 6. Appraisal See true potential
- 7. Achievement Create opportunities to achieve and succeed
- 8. Accessibility Be available to talk
- 9. Appreciation Walk in their shoes
- 10. Allegiance Always be in their corner

Sometimes applying these consistently can be tough, but if we do, it will help build empowering and motivating relationships with those we encounter each day. What an important part we play, not only in the lives of children, but others as well. Sometimes it can be very overwhelming, but the joy that comes is so rewarding. Hold on to the precious moments you have with those you love.

Final Weeks of School - Submitted by: Elaine Wright, Administrative board member

Now is the time of year to prepare for the final weeks of school. It is understood that this involves award assemblies, field days and other closing activities, but schools have been asked to follow the guidelines listed below in order to minimize disruptions:

- *Textbook check-in should occur only during the last week of school. Following that, teachers should prepare lessons that do not require the use of textbooks.
- * Locker and desk clean out occurs only during the last three days of school.
- * Yearbook distribution occurs only during the last two days of school prior to promotion/graduation (secondary).

Last day of school:

- * Lunch will be served on the last day of school to <u>elementary</u> students. <u>No lunch will be served in secondary schools.</u>
- * Refunds are given only on the last day of school (secondary).
- * Elementary schools (and Hartvigsen) are on a planning day schedule. Junior high schools are out at 12:05 p.m. High Schools are out at 11:30 a.m.

End of Year Security: Make sure the security person (Unified, WVC, Taylorsville officers, etc.) you are using <u>has been hired in Human Resources</u>. They should be paid on a *Special Activities Report* form, which is sent to your School Accountability Services (SAS) Director after being signed by your principal. Contact your SAS secretary if you need the budget number.

Recipe Corner: Easy office recipes

Chocolaty Popcorn

12 cups butter-flavored microwave popcorn

- 1 package (12 oz.) semisweet chocolate chips
- 2 tsp. shortening, divided
- 1 package (10-12 oz.) vanilla or white chips
- 2 cups coarsely chopped pecans toasted

Place popcorn in a greased 15-inX 10-in pan, set aside. Place semisweet chips and 1 tsp. shortening in microwave uncovered, at 70% power for 1 minute, stir smooth. Drizzle over popcorn.

Place vanilla chips and remaining shortening in a microwave bowl and microwave uncovered at 70% power for 1 minute, stir until smooth. Drizzle over popcorn, toss gently to coat as much popcorn as possible. Sprinkle with pecans. Chill till firm before breaking into pieces. Yield: 16 cups

I know we are all trying to eat healthy snacks in our offices, BUT at this point, as we prepare for the end of the year, I thought we all needed a little chocolate. Besides', chocolate is a vegetable! Enjoy!
