Peanut Butter Cookies

Preheat oven 350 degrees Bake 8-10 minutes

1 cup peanut butter

1 cup butter

1 cup sugar

1 cup brown sugar, packed

2 eggs

2 ½ cups flour

1 ½ tsp baking soda

½ tsp salt

1 tsp vanilla

Sift flour, baking soda, and salt together. Mix together with a mixer the peanut butter, butter, sugars, eggs and vanilla. Spoon on to ungreased cookie sheets. Crisscross dough with a fork, and bake.
