We are grateful for the Advisory Committee (consisting of secretaries and district administrators) for taking the time to read through the proposal, making enhancements, and for approving the program to move forward.

An improved mentor program rolled out in August 2019. This program brings in the administrators at both the mentor's and mentee's school, along with many district personnel for additional department-specific trainings. 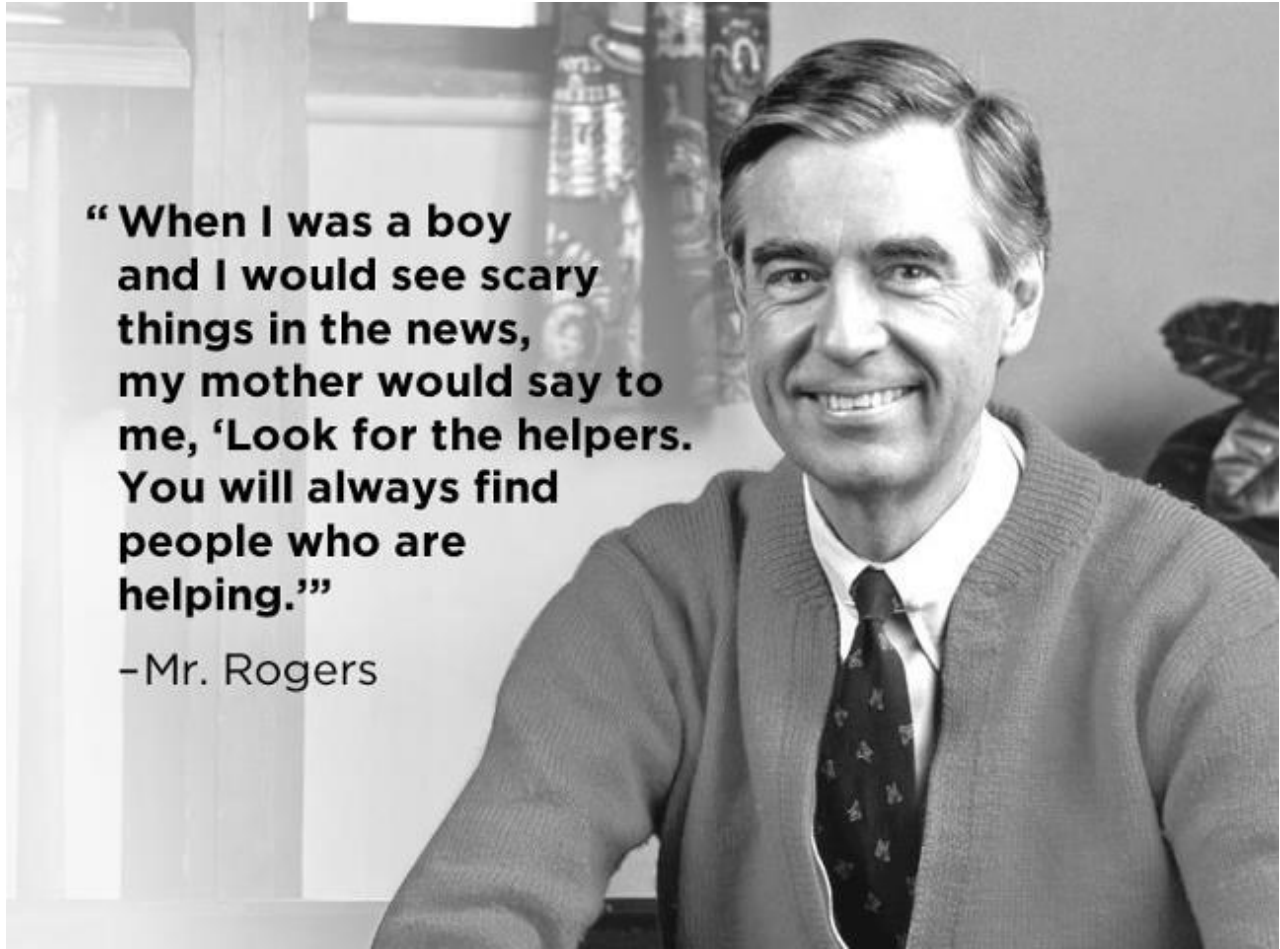

Tips for Self-care

1. Get plenty of sleep and avoid the snooze button

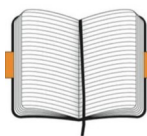
Keep a consistent sleep pattern and do not press snooze since it can disrupt your sleep and can make you feel even more tired.

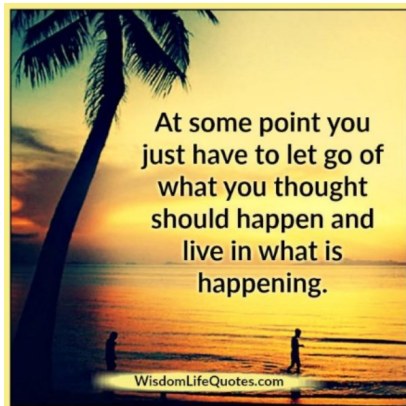

Tried & True Recipe

Chicken Cordon Bleu Casserole

Chicken cordon bleu casserole is creamy indulgence with the salty hints of ham, plenty of cheesy goodness and a crispy topping to pull it all together.



Course Chicken Dinner,
Main Course
Cuisine American

Prep Time - 20 minutes
Cook Time - 30 minutes
Total Time - 50 minutes
Serves 10
Calories 490

Ingredients

- 12 ounces dry egg noodles
- 2 cans condensed cream of chicken soup
- 3 cups chicken cooked and cubed
- 16 ounces regular sour cream
- 1 cup ham diced
- 1 cup swiss cheese shredded
- 1 1/2 cups panko bread crumbs
- 1/3 cup butter melted
- 1/4 teaspoon dried thyme leaves

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 9X13 inch baking dish with nonstick cooking spray and set aside.
2. Cook pasta according to its package instruction just until pasta is al dente. Drain pasta.
3. In a medium mixing bowl, mix cream of chicken soup (straight from the can-undiluted) and sour cream. Add chicken, ham, swiss cheese and cooked and drained noodles, then fold until everything is evenly coated. Pour into prepared baking dish.
4. In a small bowl, mix the panko and melted butter. Sprinkle evenly on the top of the casserole.
5. Bake in preheated oven for 25-30 minutes or until the casserole is heated through.
6. If topping hasn't browned, place under broiler, watching carefully, and broil just until topping is golden brown.

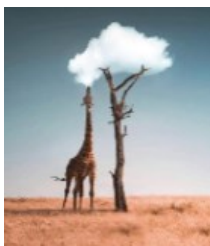
