

## **Tips for Self-care**



## **Tried & True Recipe**

#### **Chicken Cordon Bleu Casserole**

Chicken cordon bleu casserole is creamy indulgence with the salty hints of ham, plenty of cheesy goodness and a crispy topping to pull it all together.

Course Chicken Dinner, Main Course Cuisine American





#### Ingredients

12 ounces dry egg noodles

2 cans condensed cream of chicken soup

3 cups chicken cooked and cubed

16 ounces regular sour cream

1 cup ham diced

1 cup swiss cheese shredded

1 1/2 cups panko bread crumbs

1/3 cup butter melted

1/4 teaspoon dried thyme leaves

#### Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 9X13 inch baking dish with nonstick cooking spray and set aside.
- 2. Cook pasta according to its package instruction just until pasta is al dente. Drain pasta.
- 3. In a medium mixing bowl, mix cream of chicken soup (straight from the can-undiluted) and sour cream. Add chicken, ham, swiss cheese and cooked and drained noodles, then fold until everything is evenly coated. Pour into prepared baking dish.
- 4. In a small bowl, mix the panko and melted butter. Sprinkle evenly on the top of the casserole.
- 5. Bake in preheated oven for 25-30 minutes or until the casserole is heated through.
- 6. If topping hasn't browned, place under broiler, watching carefully, and broil just until topping is golden brown.
